KICK START A DISCOVERY BIBLE STUDY TODAY!



SET YOUR LAUNCH SESSION

The first step is for you to make a decision to start your Discovery Bible Study and set a date. Most people run this as a weekly bible study but if time commitments restrict this every fortnight works well also.



INVITE PEOPLE TO EXPLORE JESUS

Once you have decide to set your launch date you should invite people to join your Discover Bible Study. You can start by simply inviting followers of JESUS or if you do know someone far from God, you can invite them as well. Each week others will be encourage to reach out to the lost and bring them to the group.



RUN YOUR DISCOVERY BIBLE STUDY WITH THE WORDS OF JESUS

The focus of the JESUS SAID IN RED campaign is to reach an online audience with the words of Jesus. There are 4 studies you can use to support this campaign that cover different aspects of Jesus' teaching.

DISCOVERY BIBLE STUDY

HELPING PEOPLE DISCOVER HIS WORD

WHAT IS A DISCOVERY BIBLE STUDY?

A Discovery Bible Study (DBS) is a small group that meets together for exploring Jesus for discipleship. The purpose of the group is to help others discover what the Bible says and to encourage people to follow Christ.



WHAT IS A DISCOVERY BIBLE STUDY IS NOT?

A DBS is not based on someone being the teacher and dominating discussion. These studies are 100% about discipling people to follow JESUS and to help other followers discover God's Word for themselves. The facilitator of the group is someone who is able to lead the people by asking questions and giving everyone an opportunity in the group to contribute to the discussion.

WHY DO A DISCOVERY BIBLE STUDY?

The Discovery Bible Study method is being used globally to not only disciple people to follow JESUS but also to reach the lost. The rhythm of meeting up weekly, going through the Word and praying together helps people encounter Jesus and learn His ways. Many people use the Discovery Bible Study as a place to invite those far from God. People simply ask questions like:

- Would you like to meet up and read the bible with me?
- Would you like to meet up and read some stories of hope?

5 STAGE STUDY FORMAT

SHARING JESUS THROUGH THE WORD

- 1. Care time (5min): Give people a chance to briefly share how they are doing.
- 2. Worship (10-15 mins): Spend time to worship Jesus in song (unless you're running this group in a location such as a public cafe).
- 3. Sharing Accountability (5min): The Facilitator asks "Who was able to share the story? How has that impacted others?"
- 4. Discover the Bible Together (25-30min)

Use one of the stories listed and...

- Read the story together from the Bible twice
- Tell the story in your own words
- Discuss the story together using these Bible

FOR PEOLPE EXPLORING JESUS

The Stories of Hope is suited to people who may not be Christian who are interested in learning more about Jesus. The focus of study is to share stories of Jesus and help them discover who He is, what He did and what He said.



FOR PEOPLE FOLLOWING JESUS

If someone is turning to JESUS we recommend you run them through a series called the Commands of Christ. This is based on the Great Commission when Jesus instructed followers to make disciples, baptise and teach everyone to obey His commands.



FOR ONGOING DISCIPLESHIP

We also recommend running the Discovery Bible Study method to explore the four Gospels. This is great way for followers of Christ to go deeper and. know more of who JESUS is, what He did and what He said.



FOR DISCOVERING WATER AND HOLY SPIRIT BAPTISM

Jesus spoke about 2 baptisms, baptism in Water & baptism in the Holy Spirit. The 2 Baptism Discovery tool is to help followers of Jesus understand what the Bible says about baptism in water and baptism in the Holy Spirit.

SESSION RUNNING TIPS

FOR YOUR DISCOVERY BIBLE STUDY GROUP

These studies follow the DISCOVERY BIBLE STUDY method of running a group. It's all about having a simple structure and format and focussing on asking questions so people discover what the Word says for themselves.



- TIP 1: Prepare and pray before each discovery bible study
- TIP 2: Have a timer and stay focussed in the discovery bible study
- TIP 3: Ask questions using the discovery bible study approach
- TIP 4: Avoid the temptation to preach /teach! Let the Holy Spirit be the teacher. Simply ask questions.
- TIP 5: Stay focussed and avoid people going on tangents
- TIP 6: Help people set goals weekly on reaching out to others
- TIP 7: Organise prayer walks and outreaches out of the group meet-ups

 - S.P.E.C. asks: Is there a...
 - Sin to avoid?
 - Promise to claim?
 - Example to follow?
 - Command to obey?

SET GNALS → Fish: Who will you share with this week?



THE CHURCH CIRCLE

1. Draw a dashed circle. This dashed circle represents a gathering of believers.


The arrow represents Jesus' command to Repent & Believe. Most draw it outside the circle because this is how one begins a growing relationship with Jesus & is biblically part of His Church.

3. Draw each of the functions which your gathering is consistently practicing inside the circle. Draw the functions which your gathering has not yet practiced outside the circle.



In this example above, the gathering has practiced some very important functions of a church. However, there are a few functions that have yet to be practiced. If your church has yet to practice all the functions, make an action plan to begin practicing them today.

2. These symbols represent the basic functions of a healthy disciple and church we see in Acts 2:36-47. Some of these functions have already been studied in the lessons, others have simply been practiced week to week without studying a specific lesson on a function (ex. God's Word, Worship).





INTRODUCTION

FOR THE GROUP LEADER

Welcome to the 2 Baptisms Discovery Tool. This tool has been created to assist new and unbaptised believers to understand what the Bible says about baptism and the Holy Spirit. The Commands of Christ study in this handbook has been updated to include a study on the Holy Spirit as there may be questions or discussions that arise coming from the Discovery Bible Study sessions.

This material can be used individually if necessary, but we recommend going through it with a new disciple.

For information on how to structure a group session, please refer to the Three-Thirds method mentioned on page 31. It is important not to forget to include care, loving accountability, prayer, worship etc. in your time together.

Water Baptism

BAPTISM IN WATER BY FULL IMMERSION

Overview: A major barrier to a healthy discipleship movement in today's church is the timing and authority limitations concerning how long new disciples must wait to be baptised and who may baptise them.

Use this tool to teach the biblical foundation for these answers. In these ten Bible stories, you will witness the same pattern:

- 1. Hear the gospel
- 2. Believe in Jesus
- 3. Confess Jesus as Lord
 - 4. Repent from sin
- 4. Be baptised immediately
- 5. Receive the Holy Spirit with an overflow

Outbursts of tongues, prophecy and praises to God were all listed in the Book of Acts.

- (1) Acts 2:41 3,000 baptised in one day after confession of faith
- (2) Acts 8:6-13 Samaritans, former demon-possessed/sorcerer/sick
- (3) Acts 8:36-38 Ethiopian eunuch traveling on road
- (4) Acts 9:18-19 Saul's baptism
- (5) Acts 10:47-48 Gentiles, Peter commanded Jews not to wait
- (6) Acts 16:13-15 Women by the riverside
- (7) Acts 16:33 Roman jailer and family
- (8) Acts 18:8 Ruler of synagogue, family and many believers in Corinth
- (9) Acts 19:1-5 John's baptism not enough
- (10) Acts 22:14-17 Why are you waiting? (Ananias speaking to Saul)

BAPTISM IN THE HOLY SPIRIT FIRE

Many people who follow Jesus repent, believe and get baptised in water but they end up missing the baptism of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit was clearly evident in the book of Acts because there was an overflow of the Holy Spirit with tongues, prophecy & praises of God. Many people who have faith in Jesus and follow him lack the power of God because they have not yet received the baptism of the Holy Spirit and many people presume that happens immediately on faith and repentance.

Acts 19:2

And he said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?" And they said, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit."

- (1) Acts 2:1-4 120 believers were filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke in tongues.
- **(2) Acts 8:16-25** Holy Spirit not poured out, so they laid hands on them. The Holy Spirit was externally evident to Simon the sorcerer.
- **(3) Acts 10:44** The Holy Spirit fell on the gentiles and they spoke in tongues and praised God.
- **(4) Acts 19:1-2** Believers had not yet received the Holy Spirit, they prayed to receive the Holy Spirit & spoke in tongues and prophesied.

When did they receive the Holy Spirit?
Where did they receive the Holy Spirit?
How did they receive the Holy Spirit?
